Unique Child

At S107 we recognise that every child is unique and learns and explores in different ways. We strive to develop each child to their full potential by offering a play based approach to learning and development, taking individual interests, needs and learning styles into account. A rich curriculum supports development in the following areas building on children's interests.

Positive Relationships

Relationships are at the heart of S107's Early Years Centre. We foster a sense of belonging for each child by being sensitive and responsive to the children's needs, feelings and interests. Children are supported to build strong relationships with their teachers, their peers and their learning environment. At the heart of our teaching is valuing the children's efforts and independence in order for them to become confident and life-long learners.

Enabling Environments

Children learn and develop in enabling environments in which their experiences respond to their individual needs and there is a strong partnership between school and home. Our Early Years Centre benefits from extensive indoor and outdoor provision which provides rich opportunities through play and support for children to take risks and explore. Teachers observe and listen to children, asking questions to discover their ideas and curiosities. With this understanding, teachers act as a support and a resource for children, considering how children's thinking might be guided toward new discoveries.

Our Primary curriculum has been developed to incorporate the coverage and rigour of the English National Curriculum, but taught through in inquiry based approach which encourages students apply their knowledge and make connections. Our curriculum provides children with authentic learning experiences that explore real-world problems by going beyond subject boundaries. The themes cover and incorporate meaningful links between subjects, whilst still maintaining academic rigour.

Learning in primary is centred around the whole child, providing meaningful learning opportunities both inside and outside the classroom, via a wide range of academic, enrichment, extra curricular, sporting and residential activities.

Teaching and Learning

Our belief is that children learn best through hands-on experiences, in an environment where they are active participants in their learning. S107's teachers are experienced and passionate about children's learning and development. Classes are taught by qualified international teachers and supported by Teaching Assistants working together to support children's progress. Our teachers are experts at leading the learning and plan core subjects in literacy, mathematics, arts, science, and social studies including geography and history. This is enhanced by specialists teaching classes in art, design and technology, music, physical education, swimming and world languages.

Collaborative learning is at the heart of our curriculum, and helps to foster the development of skills that contribute to students' personal, emotional and academic success. We recognise the potential of each child and adopt an inclusive approach that accommodates different learning styles and needs.

Caring Community

At S107, we are proud of our small community feel, where relationships come first. Our students are supported to build strong relationships with their teachers, their peers and the wider school. Meaningful links are made between school and home, as we recognise the importance of each child's home and family experience in supporting their development. 
Trips and Residentials
